Thank you for your further email dated 8 August, requesting further assessments of the bend at the junction of Whittingham Lane, Cumeragh Lane and Camforth Hall Lane.

Our Road Safety Officers conducted an assessment and as a result of the investigation of the casualty and speed data for Whittingham Lane and Cumeragh Lane, we have prioritised the instalment of temporary signage. These signs help remind drivers to think about their speed. We will install these during the period of October to December 2024. We will erect these again during the period of April to June 2025, to maximise the effect of the message.

Our Traffic Safety Senior Officer also inspected the location and concluded that as there is currently 'bend ahead' warning signs on both approaches to this bend, to pre warn all motorists of the approaching bend, that no further traffic calming measures would be considered at this time.

Finally, it may be worth noting that residents may benefit from the use of the Lancashire Speed Toolkit. The toolkit gives examples of how local residents can raise awareness of speeding and road safety issues in their local area and is available on the Lancashire Road Safety Partnership website. If residents witness regular incidents of nuisance or dangerous driving, they can contact the police directly either by the non-emergency telephone number: 101, or on the Lancashire Constabulary 'Do It Online' webpage, with a record of the registration numbers of the vehicles.
